Enjoy Every Exam

Before Exam

- ✍ Method of Study: It is highly recommended to have a few sheets of paper along with a pen or pencil so that every chapter once studied can be recalled rightly by way of a self-written test.
- ✍ Personal Time Table: One must decide in advance what subject and when it is to be studied for which a person must be able to frame a personal time table in such a way that the person is able to spend minimum of 12 hrs in personal studies in which 10 hours is spent in studies and 2 hrs spent in revision. After every 1 hour it is better to have 10 min of break.
- ✍ Check list- list that has the contents to be studied in a day: One must frame a check list on one's own free will and check if the person has completed studying all the contents for the day before going to bed.
- ✍ Revision: It is better that a person stops studying before two weeks of the exam. In other words, stop studying new things and spend the weeks revising what is already studied.
- ✍ Short notes: It is better to have personal short notes for equations, formulae and for any tough content to be used only at revision.
- ✍ Concentration: In order to easily concentrate on what one studies, one must shun, by all means, listening to songs, watching TV and unnecessary gossip with the people at home as well as the people around the study.

- ✍ Self-Confidence: A proper imitation of all the instructions mentioned above would boost up the self-confidence to a great extent.
- ✍ Accountability: Every person is accountable to have all the materials used for the exam (pen, pencil, eraser, scale...etc.) and check before the day of exam if one has all the materials at hand.
- ✍ Prayer: Eventually, one can pray to one's own God on a psychological dependence in order to gain peace of mind and self-confidence.

During Exam

- ✍ Personal Duty: As soon as one enters the exam hall, the person must check himself/herself and the place in order to free oneself of any unnecessary written piece of paper and if any person comes across anything written on desk, it is highly advisable to show it to the examiner. Consideration about the examiner and the co-examinees can be avoided in order to set aside time and the power of concentration.
- ✍ Prayer: One can pray at one's own free will for a minute or two before looking into the question paper but drawing any symbol of God on the answer sheet is strictly prohibited.
- ✍ Disposition: Once the question paper is handed over to the students, every student should peruse the question paper having a balanced mentality irrespective of easy and tough questions.
- ✍ Presentation: The method of writing the easy questions at the beginning and the tough ones later can be followed depending on the subjects but it is highly advisable that one strictly follows the order of the question paper in order to make the evaluation easier.
- ✍ Method of Answering: One is requested to avoid circumlocution and answer the questions point by point. Answers relating to equations and formulae can be explained through various diagrams and required figures. In writing the answers it is better that a person uses the pen one got used to rather than using a new pen.
- ✍ Time Management: It is the responsibility of every person to know how much time to be spent for any and every question depending on the marks and the no. of pages to be written. All the other work of embellishing the answer sheet can be taken care of after the completion of the whole paper and the review.
- ✍ Review of Answer sheet: In order to have a better review, one must finish the exam at least 15 minutes in advance so that a person is able to easily allot time for a clear review of all the answers along with their numbers and the way of presentation.

After Exam

- ✍ Free Mind: After every exam, one must be free of mind and leave home without any further discussion over the question paper answered on that day in order to avoid pointless mental disturbances which would serve as impediment for the preparation of further papers.
- ✍ Good Behaviour: It is never a compulsory part of the exam that a student must meet the teacher concerned after the exam but it can come only out of a good behaviour and family backdrop of a student. On a clear assumption that meeting a particular teacher would really be an impediment for the forth coming exam, it is better that any student ignores it.
